## The brief

This piece of work set out to understand where we are at with fandom of Women's Sport.

There's lots of research that cites number of fans for Women's Sport, but a gap when it comes to depth of fandom, or to scale the 'opportunity audience'.


## What we asked

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## How does it compare?

When comparing to another recent YouGov survey that asked whether 'you follow Women’s Professional sport' - only 6.6 m said yes.

When we went deeper into this and asked fans to pick a description that reflected their feelings and behaviour in relation to Women's Sport, we had an audience of 18.8m.

Please select one option
I'm a Big Fan - I feel passionate about the team/s, individuals, and tournaments that I follow. I regularly stay up to date on the progress, watching, reading or listening to related content. Or attending events. I tell people I'm a fan, it's important to me. It's part of my identity. (1.6m)

I'm a Casual Follower - l've got an interest in Women's Sport, I keep up to date with some of the headlines through a season or tournament. I know who's who for the sports I'm interested in. But I wouldn't describe myself as a passionate fan. I'd call myself a casual follower. (10.2m)

I'm a Big Eventer - l'm wouldn't say l'm a fan of Women's Sport day to day, I don't stay up to date on it. But, I might get interested during big events - the one's everyone's talking about. I enjoy getting involved in the big moments. Or I might go to an event with a friend. It's something l'll get into from time to time but it's not something that captures my interest all of the time. I'm a big eventer. (6.9m)

I'm a Not Yet a fan - Women's Sport isn't something I'm interested in. I wouldn't call myself a fan, but l'm open to the idea of it
I'm a Non-fan - I dislike Women's Sport and avoid watching it. It's not for me
